This morning the attached document was communicated at the C-Trade Meetings. Three questions or statements resulted from the presentation.

Nunavut stated they agreed with all that had been stated and would find it difficult to access the U.S. market and obtain a waiver. They recommended Canada play the Nunavut Inuit card as leverage to open the door to obtaining a waiver and have the east coast sealers follow.

The North West Territories also expressed interest in the issue and inquired whether an exemption for Alaskan aboriginal seal products was still in effect. URE stated it was our understanding such exemptions are still in place; however, Alaskan's are restricted to traditional products.

Newfoundland reported they want to move forward together and acknowledge their willingness to continue working with DFO and DFAIT on this issue.
